EXTENDED DUTY SYSTEMS: ALLOWANCES

The current rates, effective from August 1, 1961, are replaced by the following amounts with effect from January 1, 1962:

- (a) 24/24 hour system of duty: 50s.
- (b) Day-manning system of duty: 50s.

The allowances apply where the normal weekly hours of duty are:

- (i) in the case of the 24/24 hour system of duty, 72;
- (ii) in the case of the day-manning system of duty, 80.

Where the normal weekly hours are less, but more than 56, the rate of extra duty allowance is to be calculated proportionately in each case to the extent of the excess.

RETAINED FIRE SERVICE

Increases in the annual retaining fees, turn-out and attendance fees and in the hourly payments for extra work have been made in the light of the increases in the rates of pay for whole-time members of brigades. The present and new rates, also effective from January 1, 1962, are set out below:
